Off-Leash Dog Park



Responsible Pet Ownership By-law #6-2022

- Dog owners must be present and within view of their dogs at all times

- Aggressive dogs are not allowed in off-leash areas

- Dogs must be under voice control while off-leash

- Dog owners must have a leash in hand at all times

 Female dogs in heat are not allowed in off-leash areas

- Holes dug by dogs must be filled by the dog owner

 All feces must be picked up by the dog owner and removed or deposited in waste receptacles

- All dogs must be licensed in accordance with the Village of Halkirk By-law #6-2022.



Attention dog owners

- Dog owners can let their pets socialize and exercise off-leash in a safe environment

- Please remember to keep your dog on a leash when you are outside of the Offleash Area. Other park users may not appreciate loose animals running up to them or may be afraid of dogs.

- Dog owners/walkers are legally responsible for their own dog(s) and any injuries or damage caused by their dog(s). Individuals who choose to use off-leash areas do so at their own risk.



- <u>Stoop & Scoop</u> – Please use plastic bags to pick up after your dog

- Train your Dog – Please train your dog to respond to commands, whether on or off-leash

- Respect other users of the park – Walkers, joggers and other dog owners have a right to enjoy

- Proper Licensing is required – Please ensure your pet is properly licensed
